Conference Objectives

- Develop working relationships between Adults-In-Custody (AICs and the community to reduce the nature and number of crimes and violence
- Increase access to Restorative and Transformative Justice programming by mandating and establishing Restorative and Transformative Justice principles in all Oregon prisons
- Increase access to peer mentors and credible messengers
- Enhance the awareness of the circumstances by which crimes occur by identifying behaviors and attitudes that predispose individuals to commit criminal acts
- □ Develop prevention/intervention treatment and training strategies aimed at reducing youth crime and violence
- □ Explore and develop meaningful ways in which transformed AICs can make meaningful contributions to the outside community
