Alianza: Cinco de Mayo Celebration (end of April, first of May)

This celebration through food, dance, music and entertainment marks an important date of great importance for the Mexican and Chicano communities. It marks the victory of the Mexican Army over the French at the Battle of Puebla and has come to represent a symbol of Mexican unity and patriotism.

Alaska Club: Salmon Bake (end of April, first of May)
