JD APPLICATION CHECKLIST

PRIORITY DEADLINE: MARCH 1

Application Materials and Requirements

As a good steward of natural resources, Willamette University College of Law is moving rapidly towards a paperless admission process. While we will continue to accept paper materials, we encourage you to use electronic options whenever and wherever possible.

LSAT

All applicants (domestic and international) are required to take the LSAT, which is offered four times a year in the United States (June, October, December and February) and on a more limited basis abroad.

Applicants are urged to take the LSAT in June, October or December of the year prior to that of anticipated enrollment. Applicants submitting test scores from February or June of the same year as anticipated enrollment will be considered only if space remains available.

The Admission Committee will not accept LSAT scores more than five years old. If an applicant presents more than one LSAT score, the highest score will be considered.

Application Processing Fee

There is no fee for any application submitted electronically.

Applicants submitting paper applications must submit a nonrefundable application processing fee of \$50. Make checks payable to "Willamette University." Submit the application processing fee with the application for admission.

Letters of Recommendation

Submit two letters of recommendation to the LSAC Credential Assembly Service (CAS) service. A third letter of recommendation may be submitted at the applicant's option. Do NOT send letters of recommendation directly to Willamette. Note: Letters of Recommendation are required to complete a law school report, without which your application will be considered incomplete. Letters of Recommendation sent directly to the Office of Admission may delay the processing of your application and the communication of a decision. Please monitor your Credential Assembly Service (CAS) account and the ASO (Applicant Status Online) to ensure that your Letters of Recommendation are transmitted properly.

Letters of recommendation should be written by individuals who can attest to the candidate's academic aptitude and intellectual capability for law school. References from employers or business colleagues are acceptable if a candidate has been out of school for a long period of time.

Evaluations, a new web-based service available through LSAC, are accepted in addition to letters of recommendation. Evaluations are optional and may not take the place of letters of recommendation. Applicants are welcome to submit up to two evaluations through CAS.

Official Transcript(s)

Submit an official academic transcript from EVERY graduate and undergraduate (community college and four-year institution) attended. Academic transcripts should be submitted to CAS and NOT to Willamette.

Personal Statement

A personal statement is required and should be attached to your electronic application for admission. The personal statement is a very important part of your application. Your statement will help us learn more about you and why you are seeking a JD at Willamette. We are especially interested in learning of any connection you may have to the Pacific Northwest. Please provide information you would like the admission committee to consider in reviewing your application. We encourage you to



discuss experiences you have had living, working or studying within another culture. Possible topics could also include responses to the following questions:

- What are your career goals?
- What experiences and influences significantly shaped who you are today and how will Willamette's program contribute to your professional development?

Please limit the length of your personal statement to no more than three pages. If you believe there were factors that may have adversely affected your LSAT score or your undergraduate grades, you may, at your option, submit an explanation in a separate addendum attached to your electronic application.

Résumé

A résumé is required and should be attached to your electronic application for admission. Please include the following:

- Full- and part-time work experience in chronological order with most recent position first
- Professional honors, awards or other recognition (community, employment and military) received
- A description of activities important to the candidate's professional development and leadership abilities

For International Applicants:

International students are welcome to apply for admission to the JD program at Willamette University. Foreign nationals must meet the following additional requirements:

1.

An international applicant must hold a degree that is equivalent to the American undergraduate bachelor's degree. International applicants should contact the LSAC for additional information regarding degree evaluation services.

2.

An international applicant whose native language is not English must either take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) exam. For the TOEFL, a minimum score of 600 (paper based) or 100 (Internet based) is required. For the IELTS, a minimum score of 7.5 is required. We will also accept the Pearson Test for English (PTE), <http://www.pearsonpte.com> and have set 6.0 as the minimum acceptable score. Official test results for the TOEFL or IELTS should be sent directly to the LSAC CAS. (LSAC only accepts TOEFL and IELTS scores.)

3.

Applicants must be able to show they have sufficient resources to fund educational and living expenses for the three-year JD program and provide the following:

o

A completed Statement of Financial Responsibility form, which can be found at http://www.willamette.edu/wucl/admission/pdf_admission/Statement%20of%20Financial%20Responsibility%20for%20WUCL.pdf

o

Official bank verification of funds (written in English), showing that you and/or your sponsor have sufficient resources to cover your educational and living expenses for the three-year JD program. Applicants who submit bank documents showing only one year of funding must attest that adequate funding is available from the same or an equally dependable source for the second and third years of the program.

o

A photocopy of the name/photo page of your passport showing your image and the correct spelling of your name.

All appropriate documentation must be sent by admitted students and received and approved by the College of Law before the school will send them an I-20 (Application for Student Visa).
