Advocacy

<input type="checkbox"/> ● Include the roles and responsibilities of advocates in published campus sexual assault policies and protocols	
<input type="checkbox"/> ● Advertise crisis intervention services available to students on and off campus	
Medical and Counseling	
<input type="checkbox"/> ● Provide access to the full range of sexual assault medical services, including forensic evidence collection conducted by a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE)	
<input type="checkbox"/> ● Provide access to both female and male providers	
<input type="checkbox"/> ● Provide free or affordable medical and counseling services for survivors	
<input type="checkbox"/> ● Require training in sexual assault response for all medical and counseling professionals	
<input type="checkbox"/> ● Establish a system for health services staff to document the occurrence of sexual assault without providing identifying information	
Residence Life	
<input type="checkbox"/> ● Implement a policy in which the alleged perpetrator's housing arrangements must change rather than the survivor's in order to create distance between them

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## Academic Support

- ☐ ☒ Implement a policy in which the alleged perpetrator's class schedule must change rather than the survivor's in order to create distance between them
- ☐ ☒ Remedies for a survivor may include arranging for the re-take a course or withdraw from a class without penalty

## Campus Safety

- ☐ ☒ Require criminal history checks on all campus public safety officers
- ☐ ☒ Require sexual assault training for campus public safety officers and staff
- ☐ ☒ Establish a Memorandum of Understanding with local Law Enforcement that clarifies the roles/responsibilities of each entity in campus sexual assault cases
- ☐ ☒ Notify complainants of their right to file a Title IX sex discrimination complaint with the school in addition to filing a criminal complaint
- ☐ ☒ Track and report various criminal offenses, including forcible and non-forcible sex offenses and aggravated assault
- ☐ ☒ Track and report domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking (by March 2014)
- ☐ ☒ Provide a notice of availability of the annual crime reports to all current and prospective students and employees
- ☐ ☒ Policy regarding timely communication of serious crimes or emergencies to the campus community (timely warning)
- ☐ ☒ Withhold survivors names when providing a timely warning
