Medical and Counseling Provide access to the full range of sexual assault medical services, including forensic evidence collection conducted by a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) Provide access to both female and male providers Provide free or affordable medical and counseling services for survivors Require training in sexual assault response for all medical and counseling professionals Establish a system for health services staff to document the occurrence of sexual assault without providing identifying information	
Residence Life Implement a policy in which the alleged perpetrator's housing arrangements must change rather than the survivor's in order to create distance between them Students who serve as advisors in residence halls must have training in sexual assault response
